COLLOSAL WASTE OF MONEY AND RESOURCES ON BUILDING NEW JAIN TEMPLES

It is understood that as many as hundred new Jain temples are built every year in different parts of the country. Assuming a meagre figure of Rs. 1 crore for each temple, the total sum of money involved on building new temples every year and on their installations (Pratishtha ceremonies) can not be less than Rs. 100 crores. It is a huge expenditure incurred by the Jain community in the name of faith and religious compulsions. On the other hand, there are hundreds of Jain temples in the country lying in a dilapidated condition, some of which, particularly in the south, are in total neglect. There is no one to look after these temples and many have been taken over by other communities. Many of these do not find anyone to perform worship and still, there are many others which are lying under lock and key due to impending court cases. The community has to think seriously about the collosal waste of money on one side and the degrading state of old and ancient temples on the other side. It is interesting to observe that there are many eminent architects and builders in Ahmedabad and elsewhere who are highly specialized in design, architecture and construction of Jain temples and they are mining money out of these projects from Jain institutions and trusts.

JAINA CONVENTION IN NEW JERSEY DRAWS THOUSANDS

Over 5,000 people attended a huge Jain convention that brought together several spiritual leaders like Sri Sri Ravi Shankar, Gurudev Chitrabhanu and yoga guru Swami Ramdev. The three-day event was the 14th biennial convention of JAINA - and the broad theme of the convention was 'Peace through Dialogue'. On the first day, the gathering was addressed by Art of Living founder Sri Sri Ravi Shankar and popular

yoga guru Swami Ramdev. Gurudev Chitrabhanu, considered the first Jain religious leader to come to the West and who inspired the formation of JAINA in the early 1980s, L.M. Singhvi, eminent jurist and former Indian High Commissioner to Britain, and Frank Pallone, Congressman from New Jersey also spoke on the occasion.

Chitrabhanu narrated the history of JAINA and its success in uniting various Jain sects in the US. Elaborating on the convention theme, he said peace through dialogue was possible only when one has inner peace. He added that Mahatma Gandhi's principle of non-violence was inspired by Lord Mahavir, the last Jain Tirthankara. In his keynote address, Sri Sri Ravi Shankar referred to his recent visit to strife-torn Iraq.



He said: 'I told them, 'You have seen that violence has not worked for four years, now give peace a chance'.' He added that Jainism was most relevant today. Swami Ramdev said Mahavir established the highest human values such as non-violence, love and compassion, and thus belonged to all humanity. He also praised Jain principles such as not eating after sunset. 'If they are followed, you would not suffer from diseases like cancer and heart problems'. The 76-year-old Dr. L.M. Singhvi exhorted scholars to establish the historicity of Jainism as one of the world's oldest religions by establishing the historicity of the 24 Tirthankaras. JAINA represents 60 Jain organisations and an estimated 1,50,000 Jains living in the US and

HIMANSHU JAIN RECEIVES PRESTIGIOUS OTTO SCHOTT RESEARCH AWARD



Himanshu Jain, director of the International Materials Institute for New Functionalities in Glass at Lehigh University in Bethlehem, Pa., received the Otto Schott Research Award on July 2, at the International Congress on Glass in Strasbourg, France. The scientist who first compared the movements of atoms in glass to the wiggling of jellyfish in water has won the top award in the field of glass science. The biennial award, which carries a cash prize of 25,000 Euros, is the most valuable prize for glass research. Jain, a professor of materials science and engineering at Lehigh, is sharing the award with Walter Kob of the University of Montpellier in France.

Jain is being cited for "outstanding work towards advancing fundamental understanding of the movements of atoms inside glass." The Donors' Association for the Promotion of Science in Germany, which administers the Schott award, also noted Jain's research into unique light-induced phenomena in glass, his studies of the corrosion of glass in nuclear environments, and his work with sensors, infrared optics, waveguides, photolithography, nanolithography and other photonic applications of glass.



Jain initially called the phenomenon the "jellyfish" fluctuations for the AC (alternating current) conductivity of ionic solids at low frequency and low temperature. He later coined the term "jellyfish fluctuations of atoms in solids." His theory met with resistance but has since gained acceptance and is described today in some textbooks on materials and their behaviors. The Donors' Association also commended Jain for the breadth of his international collaborations. Jain has worked with engineers and scientists and even dentists in Germany, France, the Czech Republic, India, Ukraine, Japan, Greece, Portugal, Egypt, China, the UK and the U.S.

The Otto Schott Research Award has been presented since 1991, biennially and alternating with the Carl Zeiss Research Award, to recognize excellent scientific research and to encourage cooperation between science and industry. Both awards are administered by the Donors' Association for the Promotion of Science in Germany. The award is named for Friedrich Otto Schott (1851-1935), a German

chemist who invented borosilicate glass, which is known for its high tolerance to heat, chemicals and sudden temperature changes. Prior to joining the faculty of Lehigh University in 1985, Dr. Jain worked as a researcher for six years at the Materials Science Division of Argonne National Laboratory, and the Nuclear Waste Management Division of Brookhaven National Laboratory. During this period he also taught a graduate course on ceramics at Columbia University in New York City and served as a Visiting Scientist at University Ñt Dortmund, Germany and Indian Institute of Technology at Kanpur, India.

Dr. PREM SUMAN JAIN HONOURED BY PRESIDENT

Dr. Prem Suman Jain, Professor and Head of the Department of Prakrit at Mohan Lal Sukhadia University, Udaipur was honoured by the President of India on the 21st May, 2007 at a glittering ceremony at Rashtra Bhawan. A letter of Admiration and appreciation alongwith a shawl was presented to him on the occasion. Dr. Jain has contributed immensely in the field of Prakrit literature during the last 35 years. He is the author of several books in Prakrit and has published about 35 research papers in this field. According to him, Prakrit is a strong link between various regional languages and without the knowledge of Prakrit, the study of ancient literature, both Vedic and Jain, can not be accomplished.

FIRST PRAKRIT UNIVERSITY BEING ESTABLISHED AT SHRAWANBELGOLA

The first ever university in the world for teaching Prakrit and other ancient oriental languages is in the process of establishment at Shrawanbelgola in Karnataka. It is being named as Bahubali Prakrit University. The proposal for formal

sanction has been sent to the University Grants Commission. The entire work has been taken up by Srut Kewali Education Trust. The work of constructing buildings has already been commenced. The main subjects covered for teaching would be Jain philosophy, Jain culture, history, art, Mathematics, Ayurved, Astrology and Archeology. The languages to be taught would include Prakrit, Sanskrit, Aprabhansh, Pali, Hindi and Kannad. Research and publication work would be taken up in due course. Fifty teachers are going to be appointed at the first instance.

AMENDMENT TO LAW ABOUT BANNING SATI-PRACTICE ACCEPTED BY CABINET

In order to make the existing law about banning Sati-practice more effective, the Central Cabinet at a meeting held recently under the chairmanship of Shri Arjun Singh, Minister of Human Resource Development, Government of India, has accepted the amendment proposed by the National Women's Commission. According to the amendment, the relatives of the person attempting to commit Sati, the Pundit present on the occasion as well as the on-lookers will all be held guilty and responsible for the act. They will have to prove in the court that they made every possible effort from their side, individually and collectively to stop the woman from committing Sati.

HEALTH MINISTER ADVOCATES STEPS TO STOP GIRL FOETICIDE

The Health Ministerm Mr. Ambumani Ramdass, speaking at a programme organised by the National Federation of Indian Women on increasing incidence of girl foeticide, advocated the need to start compulsory registration of women immediately on becoming pregnant. He said this step is now being necessitated in view of the fast-increasing number of girl-foeticide cases and decreasing sex-ratio (ratio of female to male) in different parts of the country. He suggested that this work can be entrusted to National Rural Health Mission for Women for the rural areas. For urban areas, he proposed to establish a similar 'National Urban Health Mission'.

PRO-VEG GROUPS TARGET BIRLA STORES IN MUMBAI

Advocates of uncompromising vegetarianism in the Mumbai city have found a new cause. Prominent Marwari and Jain groups have denounced the Aditya Birla Group's decision to sell non-veg food at its new retail outlets and accused it of putting profit over the community's traditions. This marks the start of a new conflict between pro-veg campaigners and sellers and consumers of non-veg food. Pro-veg groups have already been accused of blocking out nonveg-eaters from housing societies in south Mumbai. The protestors, including the influential Marwari Ekta Parishad that represents nearly 2,000 businessmen from the community, the Maharashtra Gopalan Samiti and Vaishnav Group have said that the Birlas, who have iconic status among Marwaris and Jains, are violating the basic tenets of their culture by selling "unacceptable stuff " and should immediately stop supporting the killing of animals for food. Representatives of the groups say they have sought a meeting with Rajashree Birla, matriarch of the family, to register their protest and if the retail chain still continues to sell non-veg food, hold demonstrations outside the outlets. A source from the Aditya Birla Group, however, dismissed the confrontationist posture of the organisations as a "publicity stunt." The Aditya Birla Group's entry into India's growing retail industry began with the opening of its first 'More' supermarket in Viman Nagar in Pune early this month.

Vegetarian groups not attached to any particular community have also said they do not approve of the stand that a supermarket should not stock non-veg food. Pankaj Shah, joint treasurer of Vegetarian Society's city unit said, "We cannot stop a supermarket from selling a particular kind of food. But the food should be sensitively displayed out of view of vegetarians." Shah said that while he promoted vegetarianism, he did not believe in forcing shops not to sell non-veg food. NEERA JAIN'S JEWELLERY FOUND MISSING FROM BANK LOCKER IN DELHI

Gold and diamond jewellery worth several lakh rupees were found missing from a locker of Vijaya Bank. A case of theft has been registered. Neera Jain, the complainant, had gone to the bank to take out her jewellery when she found the valuables missing from the locker. To her utter surprise, the locks were intact but the locker was empty. The family had been operating the locker for more than a decade.

DELHI BUSINESSMAN RAJINDER JAIN SHOT AT, RS 7.5 LAKH LOOTED

July 16: A businessman was shot at and Rs 7.5 lakh robbed off him robbery in north-west Delhi. The victim, identified as Rajinder Jain, was shot at twice - in lower abdomen, and his leg - and is undergoing treatment at the intensive care unit of Maharaja Agarsen Hospital.

The police said three unidentified motorcycle-borne youths committed the crime. According to police, the assailants overtook Jain, who was riding a Scooty, near Dayanand Park on Lawrence Road and forced him to stop. The assailants first asked the businessman to hand over the bag with cash - Jain had kept in the scooter's dickey - and shot at twice once he refused. The police are at present interrogating eyewitnesses.

SANJAY JAIN, JEWELLER HELD FOR BORIVLI (MUMBAI) BUILDING CRASH

Six days after Laxmi Chhaya building collapsed at Borivli, the police have arrested the jeweller Sanjay Jain, who carried out structural alterations in his shop on the ground-floor, precipitating the crash. Sanjay Jain, 32, owner of Vardhaman Jewellers, has been booked under Section 304 of the Indian Penal Code for culpable homicide not amounting to murder. Jain is one of four brothers from a family accused of doing up the interiors of their unit at the expense of the building's stability. They had allegedly reduced the width of a pillar, damaging the foundations of the seven-storied building. Laxmi Chhaya came down like a pack of cards on July 18, killing 29 people and injuring 18 others. According to the FIR filed by the police, Kailash Jain has been held responsible and declared a wanted accused. "He is absconding for three days," deputy commissioner of police Makarand Ranade said. The police said Sanjay Jain had been arrested since shop number 5 was registered under his name. Jain had earlier made an application to the society requesting minor repairs. "Even though permission was not granted, he went ahead and started chipping off the main pillar that was crucial to the building," said a resident. The neighbours had in fact urged the jewellers to stop the renovation work as they thought it was perilous to the building.

AFTER MUMBAI BUILDING COLLAPSES, PRAYER FOR THE LIVING AND THE DEAD

July 19: Draped in white saris and walking bare feet, a group of 15 'Jain Sadhvis' chanted in chorus-'Sankheswara Pashwanathayan Namah'. The Sadhvis meditated from 5 am to 2 pm at an apartment close to the collapsed structure. These Sadhvis belong to the nearby Sambhavnath Jain temple in Borivli. The police and the authorities carrying out rescue operations had put barricades to prevent people from entering the site. However, the Sadhvis went to the spot early in the morning for a short span and touched the pile of rubble. After spreading the message of 'Ahimsa' as taught in Jainism, they left the site quietly.

RENU JAIN, DELHI ALLEGED HER MOTHER-IN-LAW FOR KILLING HER NEW-BORN DAUGHTER

Renu Jain, 23, told police that her mother-in-law, Raj Bala, killed her 25-day-old daughter on Monday while giving the baby a massage. "I was feeding my daughter when my mother-in-law came and took the baby to the other room. After a few minutes the baby fell sick and had to be admitted to a nearby hospital. My baby's condition deteriorated and she died in the evening. She alleged her mother-in-law had "done something" to the baby when she took her to the other room. Her in-laws immersed the baby's body in the river Yamuna in a hurry early on Tuesday. Renu had married Vijender Jain in 2005 and said her relationship with her husband was bitter because of her in-laws. Acting on her complaint, police recovered the body of the baby after several hours of search in the river and sent it for post mortem.

U. K. TEXTBOOK FOR CHILDREN ABOUT JAINISM LAUNCHED AT HARROW CIVIC CENTRE

The book, called Discover Jainism, covers the history of the religion, its practices, importance figures, and beliefs. Colin Hynson, the author of the book, said at the launch: "This book is an opportunity for people, especially children, to understand other communities in Britain, and possibly learn something they haven't heard before. I hope this book goes some way towards explaining the impact of Jainism in Britain and through history." Discover Jainism, developed in conjunction with the Institute of Jainology, is the third in a series of national curriculum-standard texts that aim to teach young children about different religions. Previous books have covered Hinduism and Islam, and a new book on Baha'i is being planned for next year. The textbook has been developed alongside with a website - www.learnjainism.org. The website has material for school teachers as well as interactive games, such as crossword, jigsaws, and even Jainism bingo. The launch of the book was organized by Harrow cllr Navin Shah.

PROMINENT JAIN INDUSTRIALIST GOLCHHA PASSES AWAY

KATHMANDU, June 29: Hulas Chand Golchha, a renowned industrialist in Nepal passed away at his residence at Sitapaila. He was 75. He was suffering from liver and cardiac problems, high blood pressure and diabetes for the last few months. He is survived by his wife and four sons. His last rites were performed at Aryaghat, Pashupati this afternoon. Golchha passed away a day after Prime Minister Girija Prasad Koirala went to his residence to meet the ailing industrialist who headed the Golchha Organisation in Nepal. Golchha Organisation is involved in various businesses including manufacturing of zinc plates, food processing and jute. Golchha was the owner of at least a dozen industries. Golchha was also a consular general of Poland to Nepal. He worked for 23 years at the Federation of Nepalese Chamber and Commerce Industries and was honoured with the Rajat Jayanti for his contribution. International Lions Club honoured

him '15 years Chevaron Padak.' World Hindu Federation, Kathmandu Lions Club and Sanatan Dharma Seva Samiti had also honored him. Golchha received membership from more than 100 countries and gained consultative status from all the UN agencies.
