JAIN SAINT SETTLING FOR HOLY CHATURMAS PERIOD




The holy period of four months "Chaturmas", which is much observed in Jainism has begun. Chaturmas is the period of rainy season in the country and meant for self-purification. All over country Jain Saint reach their Chaturmas destination for next four months. Jain Saints observe their annual 'Rains Retreat' during this period by living in one place during the entire period amidst lay people and giving religious discourses or teaching meditation to the local public. For the Jain Saint, Chaturmas is reserved for preaching, penance, austerities, fasting and religious observances. Jain devotees resolve to observe Chaturmas with vows such as observing silence; abstaining from a favourite food item; having only a single meal in a day or spending time in the company of the holy people. Among the Jains, the period is a suitable time for householders to have an annual renewal of the faith by listening to discourses on dharma, doing meditation, exercising self-control and undergoing penance; and performing charity. One of the most important Jain festivals, Paryushana, falls during this period, which concludes with Forgiveness Day, Kshamavani Diwas, wherein lay people and disciples say Micchami Dukkadam and ask forgiveness from each other.

ACHARAYA MAHASHRAMANJI REACHES CHATURMAS VENUE



10th July 2016 Guwahati: The Chaturmas Sanmilan of Tera Panth Jainism got under way with the arrival of Acharyashri Mahashramanji this morning at Chaturmas Sthal at Garal near the LGBI airport. Acharyashri reached the

Chaturmas Sthal early morning. Bimal Nahata, president of the organizing committee, informed that the Archayashri, accompanied by over 100 monks, reached the site at 8 am. Acharyashri inaugurated the newly constructed Archryshri Mahashraman Research Foundation Bhawan at 8.15 am at the Chaturmas Sthal. Then he was accorded warm felicitation by thousands of Terapanthi Jain devotees coming from different parts of the country. According to Bimal Nahata Acharyashri has come with a mission to spread the messages of nonviolence, harmony, unity, social uplift and anti-drug campaign. He is leading an Ahimsa Yatra and will stay here at the Chaturmas Sthall till November 14. 

GOVT. ROLLS OUT DEVELOPMENT PLANS FOR SHRAVANABELAGOLA



30th June 2016: Gearing up for the once-in-12-years celebration, the Maha Mastakabhisheka of Bahubali at Shravan-abelagola in Hassan district, the state government appears to have mooted a cooperative model to host devotees and tourists who flock the village in large numbers. Besides spending Rs. 575 crore, the state government has offered to grant land to other states to build facilities to host devotees from their respective states during the weeklong celebrations in veneration of Bahubali in February, 2018. Holding the first-ever meeting of the organising committee of Mastakabhisheka in Vidhana Soudha, Chief Minister Siddaramaiah not only approved the budget outlay of Rs. 575 crore for the event but also assured all possible help for the Jain Community to successfully conduct the world famous event. Later, giving details of the meeting, animal husbandry minister said the money would be spent to create infrastructure like road and rail connectivity, sign-boards, arches, etc, to guide the tourists who congregate from various parts of the world.

Cooperative model: Even though the government will be setting up nearly 25,000 tents over 700 acres of agricultural land acquired from local farmers on a temporary basis, for the first time, the state government has offered to facilitate devotees in a cooperative model. State Government will give the required quantity of land to those states from where large numbers of devotees flock to the village during the festival to build halls to accommodate devotees. Until now, the Rajasthan government has come forward for two acres of land for the purpose. The celebration recognised as the largest Jain congregation in the world, is held once every 12 years in veneration of Lord Bahubali. The celebrations include anointing of the 1035-year-old Gommateshwara statue, the largest monolithic statue in the world, standing atop Vindhyagiri mountain. The government expects about 40 lakh devotees from various parts of the world. The last Mastakabhisheka was held in 2006 and around 20 lakh people had participated. The state government had spent Rs116 crore for the event.


Connectivity Gets Facelift - The State Government has resolved to give a facelift to connectivity, especially the rail and road network. The rail connectivity to Shravanabelagola village will be inaugurated in December this year. A total of Rs 400 crore are being spent on improving the roads that lead to the Jain pilgrimage centre. Though the ASI had shot down a proposal to build a ropeway to the top of the mountain, it has approved the proposal to widen the existing steps. The widening work will commence in about a month's time. The existing steps will be widened by two feet on either side, accommodating more devotees. Since the ropeway proposal was rejected, the government is mulling over adopting eco-friendly technologies to work out logistics.

IN RAJASTHAN TEXTS, MAHAVIR IS BUDDHA, AULIA GETS BACK HANDED COMPLIMENT




14th July 2016: Jaipur: In Rajasthan Government school text book, a Class III chapter on Lord Mahavir shows the accompanying photo of the Jain saint seated, and suspiciously looks like Lord Buddha. The Jain community is enraged at the photograph of Lord Mahavir in the Class III textbook "Apna Parivesh Aur Pryavaran Adhyayan". Secretary of Shri Mahavirji, a prominent religious destination of Digambar Jains in Rajashthan, Mahendra Patni said: "Bhagwan Mahavir or any Jain deity never sit in the position of giving blessings. He sits either in Padmasan, Ardhpadmasan or Khadgasan. This is the picture of Gautam Buddha." The Jains have asked for the 'mistake' to be corrected. However, the Rajasthan Pathya Pustak Mandal has already printed and delivered 20 Lakh copies of the book. The content was prepared by the Rajasthan State Institute of Education Research and Training (SIERT).

HASTINAPUR JAIN TEMPLE TO ACCOMMODATE FLOOD AFFECTED VILLAGERS



7th July 2016 Meerut: With the water level of Ganga likely to rise in the wake of heavy rains Jain temple located in Hastinapur will open its doors and provide shelter to villagers living in flood-prone areas. In a letter to the temple management, the SDM stated, "As a large number of villagers reside in wetland areas, they could face problems when the water level rises in Ganga. We need to accommodate them in the temple as well as the dharamshala. I hope the temple doors would be thrown open to the village folk and their livestock in case the need arises." The administration has also reserved Atmanand Jain Inter College in Hastinapur to house villagers in case of a flood-like situation.

INSCRIPTION ON LAST JAIN TEMPLE IN TELANGANA FOUND



20th June 2016: A three-faced stone inscription indicate that, it was indeed the last Jain temple in the region, also pointing out the patronage of the Jain religion, 850 years ago. The inscription in Sanskrit and Telugu languages narrate how a temple for the 24th Jain Thirthankara, Sri Vardhamana Mahaveera, was constructed by one Manikya Setti and also how the revenues of an entire village called Muppayapalli was donated by Bhaktula Pochenayudu for its maintenance. Interestingly, farmers of Mallaram found the stone as they were clearing shrubs to reclaim land, eight years ago. The inscriptions have several contexts in the chronicles of the history of Telangana. It is the last inscription discovered thus far, throwing light on the construction of a Jain temple in Telangana. Then it demarcates a line for the disappearance of Jainism and being replaced by a new religious sect called 'Veera Saivism'. Also, it indicates the predominance of the Setti community (Komati today) among the Jains in those days. Mention of a lady, Giri Devasani, in the inscription indicates the value that was given to women in those days. She is said to have succeeded her father Doddalasiddhi Setti as the Chief Priest of the Parshavanatha temple, whose sculpture is found, apart from the Kakatiya symbols of the ox and the sun-moon on all four sides of the stone.

RS. 7 CRORE BIDS FOR JAIN MONK SHRI MADVIJAY RAVINDRASURI MAHARAJSAHEBJI LAST RITES



27th Sep 2016 Mumbai: Members of the Jain community in India as well as abroad bid a collective Rs. 7 crore to carry out the last rites of Shri Madvijay Ravindrasuri Maharajsahebji (62), who passed in Rajgarh, a small town in Dhar district of Madhya Pradesh. This is a community ritual where bids are called for the right to perform the last rites of Jain monks. Bids were called for 25 rituals, including washing the monk's feet, wrapping the body in a shroud, performing the last aarti and applying saffron and chandan to the body. The bidding was spirited, and the amount rose steadily. Eventually, land developers and gold dealers won most of the bids.

Jayesh bhai from Dubai, for instance, won a bid of Rs. 68 Lakh to be the first pall bearer, while the second, third and fourth pall bearers paid Rs. 42 lakh, Rs. 27 lakh and Rs. 20 lakh each. The bidder who got to wrap the body in a shroud had pledged Rs. 52.52 lakh. In the hierarchy of monks, Maharajsahebji was one of the senior-most in the Tristutik sect. Under Shri Madvijay Ravindrasuri Maha rajsahebji, 85 devotees, 10 men and 75 women had taken 'diksha'. "The money collected by the Mohankheda temple in Rajgarh, where he died, will be used by the temple trust for religious activities and to continue the work undertaken by the monk," said a source from the temple. Babulal Vardhan from Rajasthan bathed the body of Shri Maharajsahebji, before he was placed on the pyre, for a sum of Rs. 41.41lakh. The practice of bidding, or 'ghee bolo', started 450 years ago to catalyse community charity. Bids are not invited at every monk's passing. Many funerals are performed by local Jain associations. Hirabhai Parekh, who heads the Kalapurna Suri Smarak Sangh, said "big ticket" bidding is associated with those who have a huge following.

COURT ORDERS FIR AGAINST AKHLAKH FOR COW SLAUGHTER - DR. SURENDRA JAIN VHP



The Vishwa Hindu Parishad welcomes the order of the judiciary to file an FIR against Akhlakh and his family for Cow-slaughter in the Bishada episode. Now, it is crystal clear who the real culprit is. It has turned out that the man who was supposed to be at the receiving end was actually the real criminal. On the other hand, the Hindu society, which was being portrayed as the perpetrators of the crime were the ones who were the victims. The villagers had

SALUTE TO ANOOP JAIN OF NORTHWESTERN UNIVERSITY, USA, FOR HIS EXEMPLARY VISION



First, he raised \$30,000 to build a community soup kitchen to help Tibetan refugees in north India. It was there, that he realised the importance of improved public health as a means of empowerment. He continued working in rural India before reaching Bihar, where SHRI (Sanitation and Health Rights in India), formerly known as Humanure Power, was formed. The organisation builds free-to-use public toilets in Bihar. These toilets then use the methane gas produced to purify drinking water, which is supplied to several hundred people at a nominal cost. His organisation also works alongside the community to combat other sanitation related problems. SHRI currently has four facilities, and they aim to build two more by the end of this summer. Apart from helping in sanitation in the state, SHRI also employs only the poorest of people to construct their facilities.

Not surprisingly, Jain has won many accolades for his efforts in the field of sanitation. He is in the list of Forbes "30 under 30" social entrepreneurs. He is also pursuing his doctorate in public health at the University of California, Berkeley. His free-to-use toilets are already reaching out to the poorest sections of people in Bihar. The toilets receive a traffic of around 3000-4000 people everyday. Moreover, they also distribute 100,000 litres of clean water through their water ATMs every month.


SPECIAL COVER RELEASED ON SETH SHANKARDAN NAHATA AT BIKANER

NEW BOOKS ON JAINISM




Understanding Jainism: By Prof Dr. Lawrence Babb, Published in 2016: This book is designed to be an introduction to Jainism as a religious tradition and way of life. It opens with a retelling of Lord Mahavira, whom Jains revere as the most recent of their great omniscient teachers, and stresses the key role his life-story plays as a charter for Jain belief and practice. This is followed by chapters dealing with Jain teachings as they are manifested in varying contexts: as formal doctrines but also as guideposts shaping the way of life of lay Jains as well as the monastic spiritual elite. No discussion of Jainism would be complete without a description of its extremely complex systems of biological and cosmographic knowledge, and the book devotes a chapter to showing how these systems express basic Jain concepts and values.

In the book, the author reflects on the question of the relationship between Jain and Hindu religious identities. Hinduism, Jainism and Buddhism are grouped together as ancient Indic religions. All three religions have similarities as well as differences as they have coexisted together for thousands of years, influencing and in turn being influenced by each other. The relationship between these three faiths may be understood by this analogy; Three magnificent palaces were built close to each other, using the same raw materials. Despite obvious similarities, all three are distinct and unique. These palaces may be understood as Hinduism, Jainism and Buddhism. As an introduction to Jainism as a religious tradition and way of life, this book pays due attention to Jainism's history and doctrinal basics. However, the author also traces the ways in which formal Jain teachings are manifested in the practices of both laity and the monastic elite, explores the distinctive Jain systems of cosmographic and biological knowledge, and describes how Jainism is woven into the social identities of Jain communities in modern India.

Rupani further said that there were some representation made by some members of the community for this status in Gujarat, but the government was waiting for the Patel agitation to calm down as it could have made matters worse. The state government issued a notification granting minority status to Jains on May 8, 2016.



The seers have begun their journey well in advance as they have to cover long distances on foot to reach Shravanabelagola. Among those who have already commenced their journey include 37 seers led by Acharya Vardhamana Sagara Maharaj. They started the march at Newai in Rajasthan on April 17 this year. Similarly, Munishree Prajna Sagar has also started his journey from Rajasthan. Three of his disciples are accompanying him. Acharya Pushpadanta Sagara Maharaj and Munishree Vajrasena Maharaj are among the others who are on the march to Shravanabelagola, the major pilgrimage centre for Jains.

As many as 274 seers had reached Shravanabelagola on foot to witness the anointment of the 57-ft Gomateshwara Statue atop the Vindhyagiri during the last Mahamastakabhisheka held in 2006. This time, the number may go up to 500. Many seers are expected to start their journey by the end of this year. On an average, seers cover 10 km a day. Besides the seers, thousands of devotees and tourists are expected to visit Shravanabelagola for the Mahamastakabhisheka. In 2006, the railways operated special trains from Indore, Kolkata and Mumbai. This time, the number of special trains is expected to go up as Bengaluru-Hassan railway track will be ready soon. According to Charukeerti Bhattaraka Swami, "This time, special trains may run from Guwahati, Kolkata, Delhi, cities in Rajasthan, Mumbai and a few other places."

JAIN BOOK BANK READY FOR CHENNAI STUDENTS


