TEMPLES SEVERAL HINDU AND JAIN TEMPLES FACE DEMOLITION IN THE MANGALORE AREA



Mangalore, The Supreme Court has stated that 1,201 Hindu and 17 Jain places of worship are currently under threat of being demolished because they are considered to be religious institutions that are located in public places and apparently fall under a list of unauthorized religious construction. Mohan Gowda, Hindu Jana Jagruti Vedike spokesperson stated that the government has decided to go ahead with demolishing this large number of religious structures. The verdict of the Supreme Court clearly states that all religious structures that are built after December 7, 2009 must be demolished and most of these religious structures are Hindu temples across Mangalore. With regards to those places of worship built before December 7, 2009—they will be examined case by case before a decision is

made for whether they will become regularized structures, relocated or demolished. A very short notice has been given with no opportunity for appeal and the state government in its affidavit to the Supreme Court has agreed to clear all illegal religious structures by the end of this month. Gowda further stated that although the Supreme Court has allowed for temples that are over 30 years old to be regularized, the Karnataka government is simply seeking to demolish because the process of regularizing will be time consuming and not worth their time. It's unfortunate according to him, that temples over 300 years old are at risk of demolition.

ALL-RELIGIOUS CENTRE AT BANGALORE TO HAVE JAIN TEMPLE ALSO

Bangalore: M. P. Karan Singh will lay the foundation stone for all-religion centre at K Choodahalli - Somanahalli Cross, of Kanakapura Road on January 3. The inauguration program will also be joined by former CJI Justice M N Venkatachaliah, DG&IGP Ajai Kumar Singh, Sri M (Mumtaz Ali Khan), President of Satsang Foundation, which has taken up the project in association with city-based Sakshi Foundation. The centre will consist of a Temple, a Mosque, a Church, a Gurdwara, a Buddha Vihar and a Jain Temple. The campus with lotus ponds will also have a common meditation hall, cottages for seekers and a library of spiritual and religious literature.

NEW JAIN TEMPLE AT PANAMPILLY NAGAR

Kochi: The construction of the new Jain Temple at Panampilly Nagar has been completed. The Jin Bimba Vedi Pratishtha Mahotsav and Vishva Shanti Mahayagya will be held at G-256, Panampilly Nagar, from January 22 to 24. The programmes include a procession, Aarti, Pravachan, Ghatyatra, Nithya Pooja Archana, Rathyatra and cultural programmes in the evening on all the three days. The programme is organised by Sakal Digambar Jain Samaj. The temple is made of marble and the artisans from Rajasthan and Gujarat have given it an ethnic look. The painters have done Kishangarh style of painting on the pillars with elephant and kalash motives in soothing colours. The idols are from Jaipur.

JAIN MANDIR FACES DEMOLITION THREAT

HYDERABAD: It is not just the historic Sultan Bazar which will become history if the proposed metro route is executed but also religious facets of this market. Between the half kilometers stretch of Andhra Bank crossroads to Kachiguda, there are nearly 10 important religious structures, more than 100 years old. The most prominent one is the Jain Mandir, which is the

oldest Jain temple in Hyderabad. "Though officials said they will make sure the Jain Mandir will be protected, we have our apprehensions," said Surendra Luniya, president, SBTA and a key office-bearer of Jain Mandir. Other religious places which could be affected are Hanuman temple, Bhagwan Das building, Hari Masjid, Ganesh temple, Muslim Darga, Arya Samaj Mandir and Maata Gudi. There are also two heritage buildings- Raja Baghavandas building and Nanu Bhai building which face the treat of demolition.

TEMPLES MANAGEMENTS UNITE IN GOA

Panaji, Around 300 temple managements across Goa have organized themselves under the banners of Gomantak Mandir and Dharmik Sanstha Mahasangh to tackle cases of temple thefts and desecrations. The Hindu leaders likened the state government's approach to the cases of desecrations of Hindu places of worship to that of the Portuguese regime in Goa during the colonial rule. Co-coordinator of the Mahasangh, Jayesh Thali said, "In the past six years, more than 50 murtis in temples have been desecrated. More than 250 temples have been looted. The atheist government has shown apathy towards this issue and not worked out any effective solution to stop the attacks on temples." Rajkumar Dessai, who is part of management of a temple located at Porvorim, said, "Portuguese laws are still in force in Goa to deal with temple thefts, only the name of the act has been changed. Under the act, there is no difference between a cupboard that is damaged and an statue in a temple that is desecrated. We want such laws to be discontinued." The Mahasangh has mobilized the faithful from across the state for a joint meeting to be held on January 8, 2011 at the Sri Sant Gadge Maharaj hall at Porvorim. The Mahasangh is also against the state move of demolishing temples and Hindu shrines existing in government land. It is heartening to note the progressive action taken by various temples of Goa. It is high time that management of Jain temples in the country, where cases of theft are occurring very frequently, also consider similar steps to prevent regular thefts from several Jain temples all over the country. SAINTS BRIDGE TO BE NAMED AFTER ACHARYA MAHAPRAGYA IN AHMEDABAD



Ahmedabad Municipal Council said that Shahibaugh bridge would be named after Jain Acharya Mahapragya, the tenth Acharya and the head of Jain Swetembar Terapanth group. The 90-year-old sage had died on May 9, 2010 at Sardarshehar in Rajasthan's Churu district following a heart attack. AMC officials said that the bridge is named after Acharya Mahapragya as he had delivered several religious discourses in the area. The bridge would lead to direct connectivity from Shahibaug (Rajasthan Hospital) to Delhi Darwaja without using the Shahibaugh under bridge.

COMMUNITY POLITICS FORCES ACHARYA SHRI DR. SHIV MUNI TO POSTPONE SAINTS CONCLAVE



Indefinite postponement of the most timely-conceived all "Sthanakwasi Swetambar Jain Saint's Conclave" proposed to be held after 23 years at Delhi is a unpardonable set back for the entire Jain Swetambar Sthanakwasi Sect. Acharya Shri Dr. Shiv Muni had proposed to hold all saints meet at Delhi in 2011 after a lapse of almost 23 years. The announcement was felicitated and lauded by the entire saint commune and community members every where. 

Their presence in large numbers in the country's capital would have given great opening to the entire Jain Diaspora to communicate with administration and other religious groups and sects on current subjects.

Unfortunately, from the day of announcement of Saints Assembly, regional community leaders in Delhi and elsewhere started looking for their role in this high profile event. As the Organising Committees were announced, things started going bad to worse. Confusions and disagreements surfaced on every subject whether that is place of meet, agenda of the discussion or the arrangements. Community leaders freely expressed their views and advice at all levels. They simply confused the saints with their over-ambitious and sedentary thoughts without understanding their implications. One can call it clash of egos, insecurity of their hold in the religious organizations or anything else. Probably, all these developments intensively hurt Acharya Dr. Shiv Muni and he felt obligated to cancel his well-thought of meet of all the Sthanakwasi Saints. He wanted to steer clear of any situation which further damages the image of the saint commune and the community as a whole. Many saints have expressed their deep regrets about these redundant developments.

Sthanakwasi community should learn from other Swetambar Jain Sect, where the word of 'Acharya-Shri" is always the final word. No one has the temerity to throw any pointless views. Shravaks and Saints of the commune listen and obey the

Acharya Shri as their head with all the humility and respect. In order to run an organization a lot of discipline is required at all levels of the group. All constituents must accept and honour the office of the "Head". The word of democratically elected leader should be the last word for everyone. This is in the interest of the entire community. Acharya Shri should also exercise his powers whenever and wherever required irrespective of any other consideration. We hope the leaders of Sthanakwasi Jain Sect will understand this loss of opportunity and accept their mistake with dignity and humility. We hope such muddle will not be created in future. Certain religious reforms are of utmost necessity at this time and it is high time that our leaders shed their egoistic and callous approach and look progressively for the larger benefit of the community. MEGA EYE CAMP ORGANISED AT PAWAPURI TO CELEBRATE 75 YEARS OF ACHARYA SHRI CHANDANA JI



On the occasion of Acharya Shri Chandana Ji Maharaj entering 75th year of her birth on the 26th January, 2011, a mega eye camp has been organised at Pawapuri in Bihar starting from 24th January to 12th February, 2011. About 1500 patients are expected to undergo surgical operations by eye specialists for cataract and other diseases on this occasion. Shri Chandana Ji Maharaj has in the past been instrumental in organising various social service activities in Maharashtra, Gujarat and Bihar which include opening of schools, providing medical facilities for earth-quake stricken persons in Gujarat, inspiring people to accept vegetarianism and removal of poverty by arranging jobs for the poor and

needy people. It has been planned to start Veerayatan University in Kuchh (Gujarat). Apart from three existing charitable institutions, all named "Veerayatan", one at Rajgiri, other near Pune and still another at Kuchh, two more similar institutions, one at Palitana and other at Kandivali (Mumbai) have been planned to be started soon. Land has already been acquired for these new projects.

SADHVIS SUFFER DURING CLASHES BETWEEN JAIN GROUPS

A clash was reported between two groups of a Jain Sangh at the Shahibaug area in Ahmedabad on January 1st i.e. first day of the New Year 2011. The incident created commotion in the locality near Girdharnagar Shahibaug Jain Swetambar Murtipujak Sangh and the police had to cordon off the area. According to one of the groups involved in the dispute, around 20 Sadhvis of their group were attacked and locked inside by the women of the opposite group in the Sangh building in the afternoon when the former group was performing some ritual. GSJSMS manages the Jain Derasar at Shahibaug. Two groups related to the Sangh are involved in a long-drawn legal battle over the administrative control of the Sangh and its properties for the past one decade. The police said the clash could well be the fallout of a tussle over gaining control of the administration and its properties. Shahibaug Police said, "The issue is going on for two days and on 1st January, it intensified over some arguments inside the Derasar. We are still to get a fix on the real problem, but it appears that both parties are fighting over some administrative and land issues."

JAIN SADHUS, CIVIC BODY JOIN HANDS TO CLEAN UP PALITANA

Palitana: At a time when global leaders, business honchos and the state government are set to sign various memoranda of understanding at the Vibrant Gujarat summit, an interesting MOU signed between a Jain group and Palitana Nagarpalika three years ago to solve civic problems of the Jain pilgrimage town in Bhavnagar district, is bearing fruits. On inspiration of Jain monk Vijay Abhaydev Suriswers Ji Maharaj, his followers took up the challenge to take up civic issues of Palitana three years ago. According to Moksharata Vijay Maharaj, who has executed the project, Subh Mangal Foundation carried out the civic work without taking money from government. 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SUNIL SINGHI ELECTED PRESIDENT OF JAIN YUVAK MAHASANGH



M P VEERENDRA KUMAR WINS SAHITYA ACADEMY AWARD



M P Veerendra Kumar, the famous writer, publisher and politician have won the prestigious Sahitya Academy award for his travelogue in Malayalam. MP Veerendra Kumar (born on 22nd July, 1936), a political leader, writer and former Union Minister has shown his command in almost all areas of life. An orator, thinker, author, parliamentarian, he has been steering the social, political, economic, cultural and literary scenario of Kerala for a long time.

Born to MK Padmaprabha Gowder and Marudevi Amma, Veerendra Kumar inherited the tradition of Socialist Party from his father, who was a famous planter and Socialist Party leader. Veerendra Kumar over jumped the rudimentary political spectacle of Socialist Party and rose as a leader of Socialist Front. Contacts with Ram Manohar Lohia and other leftist leaders enabled him to develop his intellectual and philosophical capacity. Born at Kalpatta in Wayanad district, Veerendra Kumar had his basic education at Karnataka and later joined Subba Krishna Memorial Jain High School, Kalpatta. After schooling, he had his intermediate studies at Kozhikode Samoothiri College (now, Guruvayoorappan College). He took his MA in philosophy from Madras Vivekananda College. He acquired MBA from US.

Several awards were given to Veerendra Kumar for his contributions in the field of instructive literature, such as C A Chutha Menon Award, Odakkuzhal Award, First Bharat Soorya Award Kerala Sahitya Academy Award, Koduppunna Award, Dubai Kairali Kalakendram Award for Religious Integration, Sahitya Academy Award 2010 for his Malayalam Travelogue.

MEDITATION PROVEN TO BOOST BRAIN EFFICIENCY

Meditation was once the domain of fringe groups bent on instilling life-changing attitudes into their inductees by getting them to slow down, take deep breaths and let the stress melt away. Unproven until now, Chinese and U.S. researchers claim to have scientific evidence that guided meditation introduces positive structural changes in the brain, which help people regulate goal-oriented behaviors without all the stress.

The research team led by professor Yi-Yuan Tang of Dalian University of Technology, working in collaboration with University of Oregon psychologist Michael I. Posner, found that just 11 hours of guided meditation is all you need to make positive structural changes in your brain. Their technique, called integrative body-mind training (IBMT), has been developed in China over the last two decades, but finally its positive benefits have been measured with the help of brain-imaging technology at the University of Oregon.

The research project, sanctioned by the prestigious National Academy of Sciences, trained 45 University of Oregon students, half in IBMT and half in traditional stress-reducing "relaxation" training. Before and after each training session, the subjects' brain functions were measured with a magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) technique called diffusion tensor imaging. By examining the fibers that connect neurons together in the brain, the researchers were able to observe positive changes in the portion of the brain that regulates emotions and behaviors, called the anterior cingulate cortex. Changes in connectivity were observed in the test group, but not in the control group, after just 6 hours of IBMT and became statistically significant after just 11 hours. The researchers have done no invasive experiments to actually inspect brain matter, but speculate that the observed MRI changes are the result of reorganization of the white matter that interconnects neurons in the brain. By increasing the myelin that surrounds those connections, the researchers claim the changes make those pathways stronger and more efficient. According to Posner—last year's recipient of the National Medal of Science—strengthening these particular pathways has already been shown to enable people to handle stress better, but this is the first time that meditation has been verified as a cause.

BANGALORE ARTIFICIAL LIMB CAMP SUCCESSFUL



The 14th Annual Mega Jaipur Foot Camp witnessed the participation of nearly 700 persons. Patients visited from Karnataka Kerala, Andhara Pradesh, Maharastra, Goa and Tamil Nadu. The camp was organised by Rotary Bangalore Peenya and Sri Bhagwan Mahaveer Viklaang Sahayatha Samithi, Jaipur. provided in the camp by the team of about five to six doctors and 20 technicians of Bhagwan Mahaveer Jain Vikalang Sangh from Jaipur. Those in need of surgical intervention are referred to M S Ramaiah Hospital for corrective surgeries. Patients and their attendants are also provided accommodation and meals.



VEGETARIANISM VEGETARIAN DIET CAN PREVENT CANCER



Cambridge: It's a known fact that vegetarian diet helps fight cancer, but a new research suggests that plants may protect us from cancer in a far more novel way - they may block a cancer's ability to grow. Populations that consume less animal food and more plant food have a lower risk of cancer and the risk of cancer in vegetarians is about 50 per cent lower than among people who eat meat on a regular basis. Plant foods are high in antioxidants, and antioxidants can protect DNA from damage that can lead to malignant transformation. As per the new study, vegetarian food can block cancer's ability to grow via a process called angiogenesis, a tissue's ability to grow new blood vessels, reports the Age. If the process of angiogenesis goes awry,

new blood vessels don't form when they are needed, or blood vessel formation continues out of control. Researchers have developed some drugs that can help to shrink tumour growth or even reduce the spread of cancer by inhibiting angiogenesis. Scientists like William Li, a researcher who heads the Angiogenesis Foundation in Cambridge, Massachusetts, are looking at the power of certain foods to block angiogenesis. The plant chemicals in the foods like apples, oranges, blackberries, vegetables like tomato pumpkins etc. seem to be able to inhibit angiogenesis so that a single cancer cell or cluster of cancer cells is never able to grow enough to cause any mischief. Some plants also contain tumour-suppressor proteins, which help to curb the growth of cancer cells. Studies in the past have shown that men who eat cooked tomato products two to three times a week reduce their prostate cancer risk by about 50 per cent. Up to 35 per cent of cancers may be caused by poor diet, and cancer risk is also much higher among people who are obese.

HOTTEST VEGETARIANS

Vidya Balan and Shashi Tharoor have been voted as the hottest celebrity vegetarians in an online poll by PETA. They beat off competition from Lara Dutta, Mallika Sherawat, Kareena Kapor, Amitabh Bachchan, Shahid Kappor, Natalie Portman and Bryan Adams to claim the title. "Their commitment to a vegetarian diet that's as kind to animals and the earth as it is to their own health makes them true royalty in our book," Poorva Joshipura, PETA India chief said.

NO ADMISSION FOR NON-VEGETARIANS AT THIS DELHI SCHOOL



New Delhi: With schools getting a free-hand from the government, virtually, to decide criteria for selection of students, guardians are having to deal with some unexpected issues. For instance, Mahavir Model School in north Delhi does not encourage admission to children whose parents are non-vegetarian, smoker or even a moderate drinker. All branches of the school have made it a criterion for parents to be austerely vegetarian and also keep away from cigarettes and alcohol.

According to the school's point system, there is a clear distribution of 100 points into various categories. 20-25 points are allocated to people from the Jain community, another 25 for those living in the neighbourhood, followed by 10 each to a girl child and those from the alumni. The rest is for people

who follow a vegetarian staple diet, don't consume tobacco in any form and do not touch alcohol. According to the Principal of the school, "It is a Jain minority school. We run the institution on a particular philosophy and vegetarianism is a basic tenet of Jainism. We respect all religions and all religious tenets are similar, except for the one of vegetarianism in Jainism. It is a fair criterion".

HINDUS BACK MCCARTNEY'S CALL FOR VEGETARIAN DAY



Sir Paul McCartney is reportedly urging India to declare a National Vegetarian Day and Hindus have thrown their weight behind his call to celebrate meat-free living and compassion towards animals. Well-known Hindu statesman Rajan Zed, in a statement in U.S. said vegetarianism, besides reducing greenhouse gas emissions, was good for ethical and health reasons also. McCartney has also requested to Prime Minister Manmohan Singh to declare January 12th a meat-free day. This is also PETA's founder day. McCartney, who has been a vegetarian for over 30 years, finds vegetarianism "very simple, tasty, and most enjoyable". According to reports, meat is responsible for 18 per cent of greenhouse gas emissions, more than transport's 13 per cent. According to an estimate, around 42 per cent of India's about 1.2 billion people are vegetarian.

JAIN MINORITY STATUS NATIONAL MINORITY STATUS FOR JAIN COMMUNITY SOON: UNION LAW MINISTER



According to the Union Law Minister, M. Veerappa Moily the Government is working out a formula for ensuring national minority status for the Jain Community. Speaking at the inaugural function of Jain International Trade Organisation he expressed the above views. He urged the Jain Community to utilise the capacity as entrepreneurs to take the nation forward. "We are with you," said Mr. Moily. He also pointed to the contribution of Jain poets to literature, particularly Kannada literature. Jain Community is a minority in some states of India. But they are not a Central Minority, said Abhishek Manu Singhvi, AICC spokesperson. He stressed the need for filing a new Public Interest Litigation for reversing a judgment of the Supreme Court that said Jain Community was part of the Hindu tradition. Mr. Singhvi said various High Court judgments had recognised the Jain Community as a minority. He asked the Jain Community to

seek national minority status. Mr. Singhvi advocated the codification of ritualistic differences between various sects of the community.

NEW BOOKS

JAINISM IN TAMIL NADU - An outcome of painstaking research, the book presents a historical overview of Jainism, with Tamil Nadu focus. The first of the 11 chapters briefly traces the history of the religion, while the second recounts the Jain philosophy and the next two describe the Jain way life. Two chapters are devoted to the advent and growth of Jainism in Tamil Nadu. The rivalry and clashes between the followers of Jainism and Saivism are discussed in the seventh chapter. The last four chapters speak about its decline, its present state in Tamil Nadu and the relics. The book has eight appendices that will be of immense value for the researchers. Tireless field worker and one who earned the commendation of eminent

scholars like T. P. Meenakshisundaram and Kamil Zvelebil, Mayilai Seeni, as the author is widely known, travelled extensively in Tamil Nadu collecting material for this project, and he notes, with a palpable sense of hurt, it took 10 long years for him to get the work published as a book — that was in 1954 and it has been republished now. INDIAN RELIGIONS -The Spiritual Traditions of South Asia - An Anthology, Edited by Peter Heehs, English, 2006 22 x 14 cm 620 pages, Paperback Rs. 495. This book is meant for people interested in Indian religion, literature, history and general culture. While scholarly in its presentation and thoroughness and based on the most up to date literature, it is meant as an accessible introduction to South Asian religion.

This is an anthology of written and oral texts by spiritual teachers from South Asia. The period covered is some 3500 years from the period of the Rgveda to the 1980s. About a hundred mystics and anonymous texts are included. All the major religious traditions are represented. No important mystic is omitted, and a number of less-known ones are included, among them women and spiritualists from the lower castes. Translations are chosen for straightforwardness and readability. Texts in which the mystic speaks of his or her own experience and its relationship to organised religion. Current controversies in the study of mysticism, in particular the question of social construction vs. universality in spiritual experience, are discussed.

FOLLOWERS OF JAINISM AMONGST SCHEDULED TRIBES

You will be surprised to know that the there are followers of Jainism in Scheduled Tribes. Scheduled Tribes are popularly known as Adivasis. Scheduled Tribes consist over 8.2% of total population of India according 2001 Census of India. According to 2001 Census of India, the total population was above 102 Crores. The population of Scheduled Tribes was above 8.4 Crores. There is a popular belief that most of the people belonging to Schedule Castes and Scheduled Tribes are followers of Hinduism. But the Sachar Committee has reported that members of scheduled castes and tribes of India are not exclusively adherents of Hinduism. According to the report of Sachar Committee and other agencies, there are followers of all religions namely Christianity, Hinduism, Buddhism, Islam, Sikhism and Jainism in Scheduled Tribes.

Interestingly, 2.6% of followers of Jainism belong to Scheduled Tribes. It means 26 persons out of every 1000 persons in total Jain Community belong to Scheduled Tribes. It seems an attractive number, but it is not, when compared to STs in other religions. We must note that other religions, i.e. Hinduism, Christianity etc are introduced to Tribals in modern era, while Jainism is present amongst them from ancient time. But these followers of Jainism are away from so called main stream Jains and Jainism. Further there are many other Scheduled Tribes which are followers of Jainism, but they do not know that they are Jains. This is not only about Scheduled Tribes. There are a large number of followers of Jainism in OBCs (Other Backward Classes), SCs (Scheduled Castes), NTs (Nomadic Tribes) and Cultivators. Jainism is a grass root religion and what is known as a Jain Community is just a visible part of the iceberg.

I ignored him for a while, but then directly asked him by sending an email that why he was doing this. His reply was funny:

'I am vegan, so I am true Jain and you are not. Because you eat dairy products. You have no right to ask me about what I am doing'. Before I could reply, he deleted me from his friends list and blocked me. This was just an escapism, not Jainism! Well, coming to the point, let me say that most of the Jains have forgotten the basics of Jainism. They think just being a vegetarian is enough for being a Jain. Some

'advanced' Jains think that worshipping idols and performing rituals and fasts are the essential things for being a Jain. But Jainism is not vegetarianism. Jainism is not a performing art. Jainism is not eating habits. Donkeys and monkeys are vegetarians. Not only that, they are vegans as they do not use milk products. They do not eat potatoes, onions and garlic. They live a peaceful life. Can we say that they are Jains?

Unfortunately, Jain monks never tell the true meaning of Jainism to the lay people. It happens because most of them do not know it, and others like to hide it. They never tell that taking vows is a later step. The first step is to abandon wrong beliefs and knowing what is right. But people are following vegetarianism without knowing the right faith and without throwing away the wrong beliefs. Just like going to college without taking primary education. Jainism is based on equality (Samatabhaav), and not on Ahimsa and vegetarianism. Ahimsa is the fruit of equality. Vegetarianism is the fruit of Ahimsa. But Jains have forgotten equality, the root of Jainism. If you are a vegetarian, or even a vegan, or even you are a Jain monk, but if you are on the wrong path, you are not a Jain. If you eat before sunset, but you discriminate people in the name of religion, language, sect, caste and gender, you can not be a Jain. And finally, if you are fully dependent on agents for getting knowledge, if you do not use your own intellect, you are not a Jain. So do not believe me, just start to think. Start to know the right path. For this you have to keep yourself away from agents of the religion. You do not need them. Once you realize this, you will lead on the right path and right faith.



There will be no fur on the catwalk at Oslo's Fashion Week next February, making Norway the first country to enact such a ban for the event. Orgnisers of the Oslo Fashion Week say , "It has been a very natural choice for us. We are doing this in order to increase ethical values in fashion."

He took diksha at Veraval in Junagadh under the influence of his religious preceptor, Saursashtra Kesari Shri Pranlal Ji Maharaj Saheb.

After taking to monastic life, he went to Rajasthan for further study of the Agam, became a scholar of the Jain scriptures and wrote many books. His profound knowledge of the Jain scriptures is evident in his books. The Jain monk, who had lakhs of followers both in India and abroad, was honoured with several awards including Agam Diwakar (Shining Sun of Scriptures) in 1968, Gujarat Saint Shiromani in 2002 and Bahushrut in 2005.

Firozabad (U. P.), Dec 28, 24-year-old Sandhya Jain was killed by allegedly by her husband and in-laws for dowry in Tundla police area. Sandhya Jain died after sustaining burn injuries in Raja Ka Tal locality this evening and her parents have alleged she was set on fire by her husband and in-laws. Sandhya's father Rishi Kumar alleged since the marriage four years ago she was being harassed by her in-laws who were demanding dowry. The police said a case has been registered against Sandhya's husband Vikram Kumar Jain, his father Vinod, mother Beena, brother Goldy and sister-in-law Vandana in this connection.

DALITS OF MAHARASHTRA LOOKING TOWARDS JAINISM

A Dalit caste in Maharashtra, which is in search of a new religious identity, is looking towards Jainism! This caste is second largest one in Dalit community in Maharashtra. It has a good population in Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh also. Interestingly, its population in Maharashtra alone is about 65 Lakhs. This number is larger than the official number of Jain population in entire India!.

In marriage ceremony rituals in this community, they have started to remember Teerthankar Suparshwnath and Mahaveer in the Mangalashtakas. In a latest development, activists from this community have started to put picture of Teerthankar Mahaveer on their letterheads, posters etc. A renowned journalist and writer from this community is presently writing a novel on an ancient Jain Acharya, who belonged to them.

A leader of this community, who is a professor with Doctorate, said to this author, "Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar connected his people with Gautam Buddha. I want to connect my people with Teerthankar Mahaveer".

An interesting fact is that this Dalit community was follower of Jainism in ancient times. Not just follower, but it gave many monks, great Acharyas and even a Teerthankar. We can find many literary proofs in Jain canonical texts and elsewhere about it. As this community was staunch Jain, and even savior of Jainism, the Brahmanical forces banned it and declared it as untouchables after decline of Jainism.

I myself am writing a book on their Jain tradition and their history, which will be published soon.

This community is poor and their literacy rate is lower. In last few decades many people of this community have got converted to Christianity and Islam. Many became victims of Hindutwa forces. But now the intellectuals and activists from this community have found their origin. In near future, their will be a socio-religious revolution in this community. This revolution will change their lifestyle. It will also affect the political and social scenario of Maharashtra.

I have talked about this subject with many Jain monks and Acharyas. There was a positive response from some of them. I am regularly in touch of activists from this community. Now I am working on action plan. This community needs a psychological support from Jain Community.

MATANG COMMUNITY AND ITS JAIN ORIGIN

Mahavir Sanglikar - Matang is a Dalit caste spread all over Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka states of India. We can trace the origin of Matangs in Indus valley civilization. Matangs have ancient history and we can find referances about them in ancient Jain Literture. According to Jain Literature, Vinami, was the great grandson of Rishabh the first Teerthankar of Jainism. Vinami's son Matang was the founder of Matang Race. Suparshvanath, the 7th Teerthankar of Jainism himself was a Matang. His Yaksha (attendant god) was also a Matang. Matangs had enjoyed higher position and statues in Jain Community of ancient India. Matangs are known as Madigas in Andhra Pradesh.
